Dr. Mann Spitler Presented Manda's Story to all Students at the Career Center

Dr. Spitler and his wife lost their 20 year old daughter eight years ago to what he called the "Beast", the destructive forces of addiction. Dr. Spitler detailed his daughter's path into the dark world of drugs and the people who use them. Despite heroic efforts by he and his wife, Manda administered a lethal dose of heroin to herself on March 30 of 2002. Manda was a student at Valparaiso High School and a student at our Career Center.

Dr. Spitler tried his best to give our students many good reasons to resist the temptations of drugs and to give them a factual presentation on the power of addiction. Students were all very moved by the assembly and appreciative of Dr. Spitler's effort to battle the "Beast".
