

Teachers, Gannon and Truelove Tour Toyota Plant

Toyota has found that they are facing a retiring workforce. They have set up a program with Vincennes where students get accepted to a program and work at the plant 2 days per week, while going to school the other 3 days.

Toyota also hires with 2 year degrees. Personnel at the plant said that the hiring process has been expedited. Once in, most workers make \$60-100k+ with great

benefits including on-site child care (where the child learns 3 languages by the age of 5), a pension, a 401K, and on-site pharmacy.

Toyota provides a great employment opportunity requiring less than a 4 year degree.....but students need to know they will not walk in off the street with just their high school diploma and get hired. Toyota is requiring specific skill sets for their workforce.

The tour of the plant was amazing. The factory was incredibly clean and the workers were happy with very little turnover. Every Highlander in the United States is now made at this plant.
