Seniors – It is Time to Pursue Financial Aid for College

Seniors (and their parents) should create a Federal Student Aid ID anytime now as the season approaches for filing Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This year, the student and the parent both need personal ID's.

Go to: <https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm>

Create a username and password. Create a challenge question and answer it. Provide a verifiable email address. If the student is already accepted at a college and already have a college email, they may use that email address.

In January, it will be time for seniors (with parents) to fill out the FAFSA by Mar. 10. The site is fafsa.ed.gov.

Every senior should fill out a FAFSA. It is free and required for many scholarship programs. Many area schools will host financial aid nights. These nights are led by college financial aid experts.

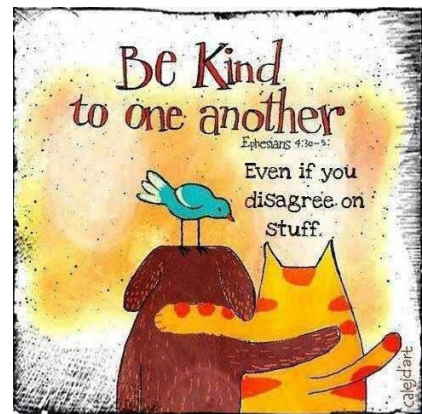


Are You Getting Ready for What You Will Do After High School?
