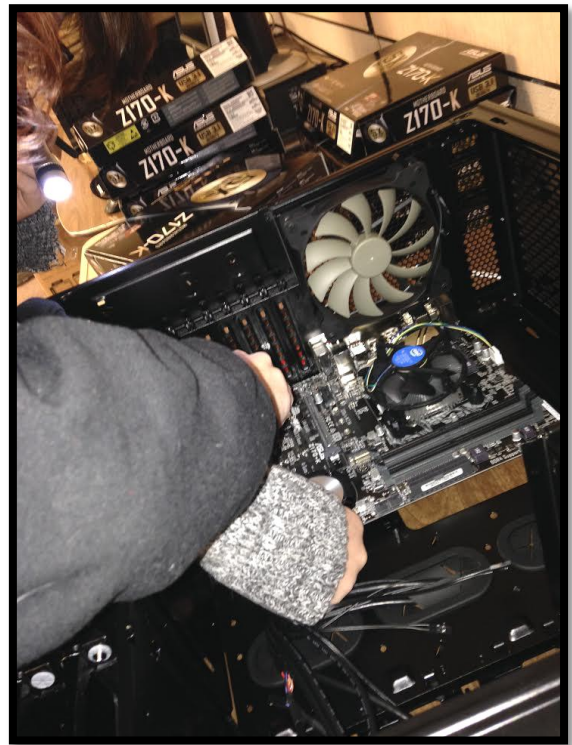

Electronics Students Travel to National Nanoline Contest in Pennsylvania



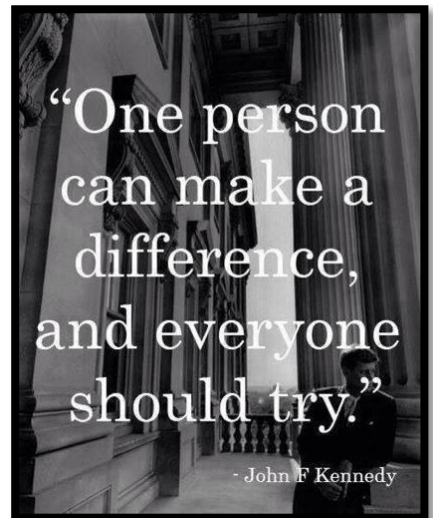

Over one hundred Wheeler eighth graders can be seen visiting the Career and Tech Center as part of their career exploration program.

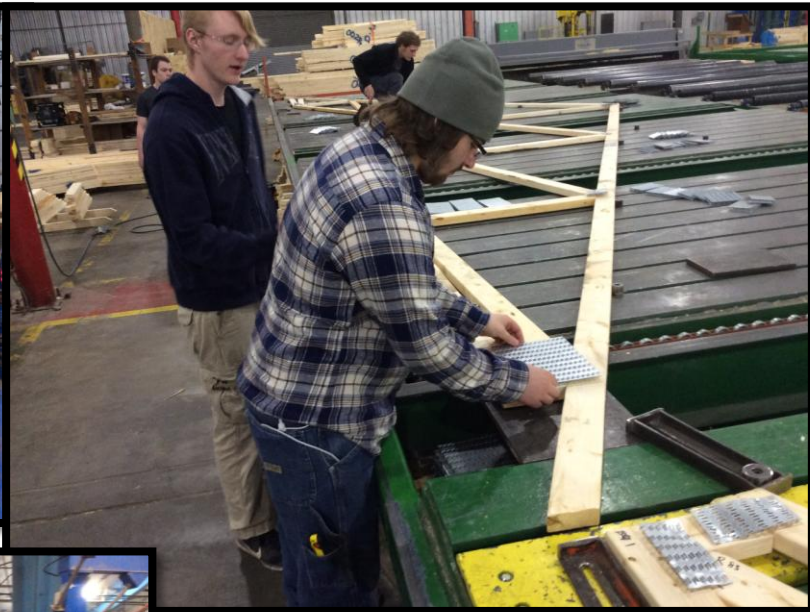

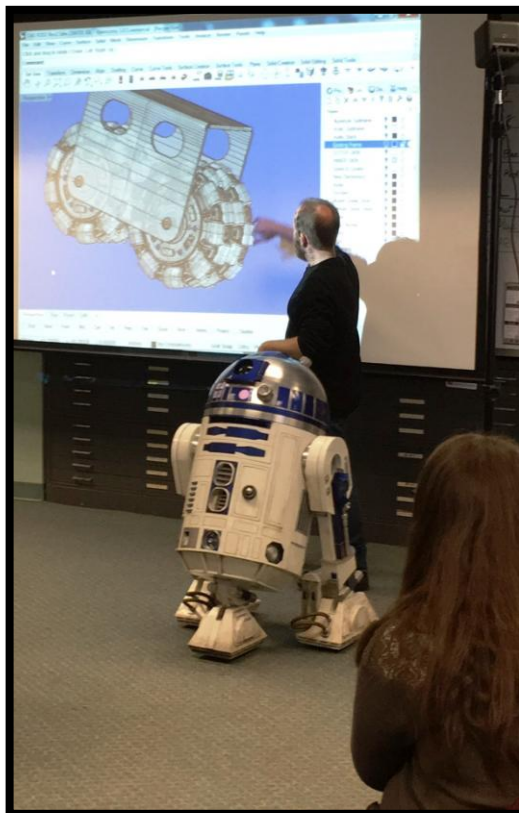
