Indiana Landmarks Award



Indiana Landmarks recently announced its 2018 Servaas Memorial Awards for historic

preservation. This year's winners include the Porter County Building Trades Corp. and Wabash Marketplace Inc.

The Porter County Building Trades Corporation (fiscal entity for our Bldg Trds program) is being honored for addressing a skills gap in training tradespeople in repairing and restoring historic structures. The organization raised money to move and repurpose the historic 1912 depot, which was set for demolition, and move it to the school. Once there, students spent three years re-purposing it into a Cosmetology School.

Next Level Jobs Debut

Starting in the fall of 2018, **ALL** Hoosiers with a high school diploma may be eligible to earn a tuition-free certificate in Indiana's highest-demand job sectors through Governor Holcomb's Next Level Jobs initiative! Eligible job sectors include Advanced Manufacturing; Building & Construction; Health & Life Sciences; IT & Business Services; and Transportation & Logistics (see attached for a full list of certificate options). This is a great opportunity for CTE students who have earned some dual credit while in high school but have not yet been awarded a certificate from a two-year college.

To be considered, students simply need to file a FAFSA. Even students who missed the April 15th FAFSA deadline are eligible! To get connected with an eligible program, students should visit NextLevelJobs.org and click on "I'm a Next Level Job Seeker." After completing a short questionnaire, Ivy Tech Community College or Vincennes University will reach out to the student to help them enroll.
